Share Support for World Relief's Work with Children

Each year on Pentecost Sunday, we celebrate the arrival of the Holy Spirit as a bringer of new life. The Pentecost Offering is one of the four special offerings of the Presbyterian Church (USA) and is about helping young people begin life with a strong start—a solid foundation of faith formed in the first third of life, from childhood through young adulthood. Gifts to this offering unite young people in Christ and inspire them to share their faith, ideas, and unique gifts with the church and the world.

Highland keeps forty percent of the offering. The Witness Committee will support World Relief with this portion. World Relief helps resettle refugees in our community. Refugee children are particularly vulnerable because of their age and experiences; a lot of children carry the scars of war and displacement with them, many never having experienced stability of home. Among other services World Relief provides to refugee children are support those facing significant health issues and mental health assessment, counseling and referrals.

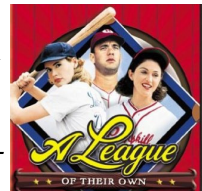
Highland Heads to the Ball Park June 8

Presbyterian Women in June

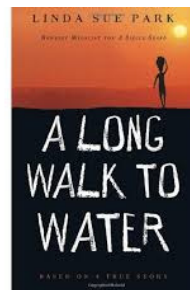
