
THE CONFESSION OF THE PEOPLE OF GOD

During the season of Lent, we omit the singing of the Gloria Patri. The English translation of Kyrie Eleison is Lord Have Mercy.

OPEN MY EYES

*AFFIRMATION OF FAITH adapted from A Declaration of Faith, PCUSA lesus was what we are. He grew up in a family and a society troubled by the common problems of the world.
