THE RESPONSE OF THE PEOPLE OF GOD

The Day of Resurrection! *Hymn LANCASHIRE

The day of resurrection! Earth, tell it out abroad, the Passover of gladness, the Passover of God. From death to life eternal, from sin's dominion free, our Christ has brought us over with hymns of victory.
